Dear Representative Linder,

I deeply appreciate your support for human rights and the rule of law and it is in that spirit that I am writing to strongly urge you to stand up for those of us in this great country who have been a victim of our flawed justice system. I also deeply appreciate you and Derick's concern for me during the time I was fighting to keep my freedom.

I have been a victim of our faulty criminal justice system several times in my life and I fully understand how innocent people can be railroaded and punished unjustly. It seems that our current system of justice is to presume guilt until innocence is proven-and this innocence is often difficult to prove in our incompetent, corrupted, and unjust system.

In fighting for my innocence I witnessed how Detective Preston Peavy, with the help of other officers with the Cherokee County Sheriff's Department, committed back to back misdemeanor and felony crimes in his consistent attempts to manufacture my guilt. Our legal system is no longer a truth seeking process, but rather an evil place where a person becomes a cog in a wheel of legal jargon and technicalities that is often latent with incompetence and corruption-and when crimes against a citizen are committed by these officers of the State, complex immunity laws often protect them.

We must simplify our legal system and use common law and common sense in the legal processes so that a person (especially the innocent) feels like a human being and not like some inanimate object of narcissistic prosecutors with tunnel vision who are only concerned for a conviction.

I won the first battle as a Defendant in a corrupted, incompetent, and unjust legal system, but not without it killing my mother, bringing undo harm to loved ones, and ruining my life. Now the table has turned and I am the Plaintiff in two civil cases, and I find myself in the same boat fighting for justice to be served.

Thanks again for your help and concern on this matter. And please thank Mr. Corbett for his help and concerns. You were the only representative in Georgia that had the guts to do something to help me.
