



The *State* of Georgia

I'm going to come right out and say it: I'm looking for people that are willing to stand against evil and those who have the courage to care about their own rights and the rights of others. To be straight forward—I need your help.

My name is Kerry Craig Walker and that is me in these pictures at top and the bottom of this pamphlet. I used to be a builder and then I became an instructor with the United States Parachute Association and I once wore my jumpsuit and parachute rig on a protest in front of the courthouse in Canton, Georgia because corruption is flying high in Cherokee County! The picture at the end of this pamphlet was taken at Box Spring in Tennessee. This fine state has become my new home and I love it here.

I was born and raised in Georgia, and lived in Georgia all of my life, and I have always loved Georgia. After being arrested in 2001 for a crime I did not commit, and then RAILROADED by a crooked detective named Preston Peavy, and a crooked system that covered for him, I moved to Tennessee. I would like to share with you a little history that I have learned about this

state and this story about what happened to me and my family in the not so great state of Georgia.

Throughout the 1800s the dispute over Native American sovereignty was a significant political issue, fought in courts and legislatures across the country. Many states maintained that Indians as individuals should be subject to state jurisdiction and argued that native tribal governments had no legitimacy as separate institutions. Many Indian tribes claimed to hold all of the rights to self-governance and land ownership that they possessed before the arrival of Europeans.

By 1832, the Georgia State Legislature had passed a series of laws which forbade persons considered as Indians from owning property within the state or even gathering to voice any objection to their plight. These laws passed by the Georgia State Legislature were in direct violation of the U.S. government and Supreme Court decisions brought about by the legal battle waged by the American Indians in our very slanted U.S. Courts.

A sentence of four years imprisonment was imposed on those who objected to the illegal acts passed into law by the State Legislature.

In order to hold meetings that would not be illegal, the Cherokee people met in council at a spring in Tennessee located just north of the Georgia state line, now known as Red Clay.

The American Indians were forced to adhere to the Christian beliefs and European social structure and children were taken from their families to boarding schools that were set up across the country by the European settlers. The American Indians and their children were even forced to dress like the Europeans!

In the southeast, strongly propagated by Georgia Politicians and the people of Georgia, American Indians were herded up in groups of about a thousand and forced across the country in what has become known as the Trail of Tears. The Georgia State Legislature was a powerful force in pushing for this "ethnic cleansing" where thousands of men, women and children, especially the elderly and the sick, would suffer and die in pain.

Through the Dawes Allotment Act of 1887, 38 million acres were stolen outright from the North American Indians by the government. As if that wasn't enough, Indian landowners were forced to sell an additional 23 million acres between 1887 and 1934 because of inability to pay their taxes and mortgage payments. By 1934 the Indians had lost nearly two-thirds of their land or 90 million acres! Legislators from the state of Georgia and

Georgia citizens were right there to support these unethical and unjust actions!

More recently, the U.S. Government passed immunity laws that allow officers of the state or members of the legislature to commit all kinds of corrupt actions against a citizen and there is little to nothing that a citizen can do to hold them accountable. Sovereign immunity law is very complex. The Georgia legislature has modified the law as it pertains to certain types of actions and agencies, and now these officers of the state and their agencies are often above the law! Georgia has some of the most powerful and irrational immunity laws in the country.

In Georgia, a judge or District Attorney, or a detective or deputy, or any officer of the state can commit all kinds of corrupt and illegal acts against a citizen and there is little to nothing that citizen can do to successfully hold that person accountable for their corrupt or criminal actions! The state of Georgia covers up for and condones corrupt, unjust, and even criminal actions against its citizens by those who are supposed to uphold the law!

During the long nightmare my family and I endured in Cherokee County, Georgia, where I was the VICTIM of a violent crime on September 16, 2001 and then falsely arrested, I became another victim of this self-serving legal system. The state went on to ignore the evidence and a witness that proved my innocence and that I was in fact the victim, as well as to alter, tamper with, and manufacture evidence to create the appearance of my guilt!!—I was forced to sell my custom home, that I personally designed and built, and my beautiful property at the corner of the Etowah River and Lake Allatoona. In selling my land in 2003, I cut out a piece of land with a two story 16 x 24 foot shed on it and I sold my property less this 1/3 acre section of land. I wrote up detailed contracts and paid \$465.00 for a registered land survey of the 1/3 acre and the deal was closed through an attorney.

I owned this small piece of land via these contracts and I had it for over 6 years. I remodeled the shed to be a nice little cabin and I had power run to it. This was where I waged a battle for over four long years against a crooked detective named Preston Peavy, and crooked government officials who covered for his crimes in this little town of Canton, located in Cherokee County. This officer did every evil deed to manufacture my guilt and to

ignore exculpatory evidence and his corrupt and illegal actions were covered up by a very corrupt government!

I won this tragic and draining battle and all my false charges were, finally, formally dismissed by the state—I then filed a 20 million dollar lawsuit against Cherokee County, the county attorney, Preston Peavy, and the Cherokee County Sheriff's Department.

This past year the property that I sold, and that my land was cut out of, was foreclosed on and the trash out crews were sent out, escorted by the Cherokee County Sheriff's Department, to trash out the house and outbuildings on the property. It was very clear to the Cherokee County Sheriff's Department that I owned this cabin and the land via a 99 year lease and transferrable lease/ownership (paid for with \$85,000.00 at the time of the closing), as I had taken all the documents to the Marshal's office and I had filed documents with county.

I had moved to Tennessee and I was lucky to have been at my cabin with my girlfriend when they came out to trash out the outbuildings on the property, and they intended to trash-out my cabin in the process. I talked to the officer and explained to him the situation. After talking with the deputy, he and the Mexican trash out crews ended up leaving.

I hired attorney Jeff Rusbridge to look into this for me and to make sure my cabin would not be trashed out until this legal dispute was settled. In the mean time I moved all of my things out of a 16 x 36 foot shed and a 12 x 16 foot shed that I had legal use of by documents made at the sale of my home and property. I worked for three days, with the help of my brother and my girlfriend, moving everything from these two outbuildings into my cabin.

I came back to the property again from Spring City, Tennessee, a three hour drive, to try to make sure these jerks would not trash-out my property. I knew there would be nothing more pleasing to the Cherokee County Sheriff's Department than to throw all my personal things and important files, and furniture and electronics out in the rain like a pile of garbage and to go through my things hoping to find something illegal! While I was at my cabin, a man named Daniel L. Clotfelter stopped by. He told me that he represented the bank and we talked and I explained to him the details of my story. He told me that he did not think there would be a problem and I gave

him my phone number and asked him to call me and let me know if they were planning to trash-out my cabin. He explained to me that I should put signs on the structure stating that this property was involved in a legal dispute and that this would insure that they would not trash out my cabin.

I contacted my attorney and his office made up signs for me to post on the structure. I also posted a sign on the door explaining that this was a separate track of land and it had my phone number on it.

I drove back and forth from Spring City, Tennessee several times checking on the cabin. I assumed Mr. Rusbridge had contacted everyone concerned, especially the eviction division of the Cherokee County Sheriff's Department. I assumed, albeit with some doubt, that nothing would be done to my cabin until the legal process was resolved.

My girlfriend and I made the three hour drive again and arrived in the evening of Wednesday, June 10th and we arrived to find all the personal and irreplaceable contents of my cabin that dated back to my childhood and contained very precious pictures and irreplaceable things from my mother and father and my entire family, piled up in a pouring rain in a pile 15 feet wide by 45 feet long, like a pile of worthless trash! My girlfriend broke down and cried and my heart broke and I felt like I had been violated by the purest of evil and by people that can't be human!

There was not a thread of goodness, not a thread of love, and not a thread of intelligence in what was done here. What was done was unethical and violated all human dignity. These people that did this are pure and wicked evil, and something is terribly wrong in the state of Georgia.

I was brought up in a family that lived by the golden rule and I was a Life Scout with 22 Merritt Badges and a member of the Order of the Arrow. I graduated with a degree in Architecture near the top of my class in 1977. I am not perfect and have had my problems, but I have been clean and sober after turning my life completely around on April 12, 1992. I did great things in my early life and some even greater things after this, but it was all destroyed and my life was ruined by these crooked and corrupted officers of the state and by the government officials who were indifferent to or part of these demented acts. I am also a writer, historian, researcher, and, most importantly, a very spiritual man.

My mother and father loved and cared for me, and I love and care for you if you are a good person. My father fought in WWII for our freedom and he went through pure hell and was a decorated soldier. My mother loved this country and she was a very patriotic woman and a very kind person, yet she died under the stress and duress of these false charges against me. She suffered for four long years with the insanity of a legal system doing everything it could to manufacture her son's guilt!

Cherokee County, and other counties in Georgia, are some of the worst at perpetrating corruption and crimes against good law abiding citizens and we need to bring these crooked goons down and I need your help to get it done.

Like I said, I am not perfect, and I understand that we are all fallible, but this does not mean that we should bring intentional harm to others. No one should have to suffer as I have suffered, and for no other reason except an extremely crooked detective and deeply corrupted politicians that turned a blind eye, and the other corrupted government employees that covered for this officer's criminal actions. When there is one bad officer, why does the government in Georgia cover for him? And why do so many citizens have these cowardice actions, and fear standing up for their rights and the rights of others?

If you are not a coward and would like to support me in my noble and just battle, then please do so. Any donations to help me to survive and to do what needs to be done will be greatly appreciated.

Thanks for taking the time to read this and to learn about the actuality of the corrupted government in Georgia and about the citizens of Georgia and the media that sustain this corruption by turning a blind eye and by doing nothing.

There are thousands of innocent men and woman locked away in prisons in this country, and thousands suffer everyday by the injustices sustained by corrupted legal processes, like the processes found in Georgia. Georgia was the catalyst for the Trail of Tears and the ethnic cleansing of these great people, and, if the state of Georgia had its way, I would be sitting in prison for many years, or maybe for the rest of my life, for crimes I did not commit.

We the people must stand tough, and our actions of goodness and love in a nonviolent revolution will bring about a new social structure that will

operate without motive, and will do the next right thing, and will operate in due process of law based on a foundation of truth.

Thank you for doing your part in helping me hold these people accountable and to educate others, and to bring an end to the evil of dishonesty and corruption.

I would like to thank everyone that stands up for their rights and for the rights of others, and I would like to especially thank the few honest officers of the state that are willing to do the next right thing and that effortlessly refuse to be part of any form of deception or corruption.
