I. DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCEDURE: The patient was brought to the catheterization suite in the post-absorptive state and prepped and draped in the usual fashion. The skin overlying the right femoral artery was and with iodine and using the Seldinger technique the artery was entered. The wire passed freely. At the time of arterial entry he was given 3,000 units of IV heparin after descending the ACT. He was given another 7,000 units at the time that it was apparent that we would proceed with angioplasty. At the conclusion he was started on heparin drip. At each exchange of the catheters or wires, the wire was wiped with a damp sponge and the catheter was aspirated and flushed.

Initially, we went in with the entire setup which included an 8-4 soft tipped Judkin's guide, .018 intermittent wire, 3 mm. mini balloon. The wire was placed across the subtotal occlusion and well down the right coronary. The balloon was appropriately positioned at the site of the proximal occlusion. This area was dilated using 8 atmospheres times 4 minutes. We then took repeat shots which showed a wide patency but a mid portion lesion. This was dilated using 5 atmospheres times 4 minutes. There was some residual proximally and we came back for one last inflation at 5 atmospheres times 4 minutes. We then waited greater than 5 minutes and took final shots which showed a good result. Appropriate doses of intra-coronary nitroglycerin were given during the case.
